

John Partridge also reported on the track survey weekend that was undertaken at Bunyip. Survey work has now been completed and signage prepared for the area. A leaflet detailing the results of the survey is due for release soon. John also mentioned that similar work for the Wombat State Forest has also been completed.

As per the June newsletter Steve Utting and Annie Simpson have resigned their positions as Newsletter Editors due to work commitments. We would like to take this opportunity to thank them for all their hard work and dedication in the past year.

Mark and Julie Capper have kindly volunteered to take on the position henceforth and we would like thank them for stepping into the breach so readily. Association Report (John Partridge reported as follows):

Bunyip/Toolangi: John Partridge gave the association report details of which are published later in the newsletter.

John also gave a detailed talk regarding the recent work at Bunyip and Toolangi.

Bunyip

- Recreation Framework for Public Land has been released.
 Three options were put forward for consideration.
 - The association were hoping for Option 2 to succeed which would keep the tracks between Black Snake Ck Rd and Burgess Rd open
 - o The minister has gone for option 3 and we have lost these tracks as well.
- We now have 35kms of track network comprising of 12 tracks mostly of Blue to Black Diamond status.
- There is another 10-15kms of tracks to be made into MVO (Management Vehicle Only) tracks, which FWD Clubs will have some access to.
 - o How this will work will be sorted out over the next month or two.

Toolangi

- A number of tracks in Toolangi have been graded
- Some of these were proposed in budget, but many were not.
 - Not a big issue with tracks being graded as long as the nature of the track hasn't dramatically changed.
- There are a number of tracks that have been closed
 - We have a big problem with the ranger there and I am looking into it.
 - FWD Vic is supposed to be consulted before track works/closures happen, but this hasn't been the case.
 - I have spoken the forest Manager who will find out what is happening there and will report back to me
 - I have asked for a cessation of works until we can find a way forward on this.
- FWD Vic has a MOU (Memorandum of Understanding) with both Parks Vic and the DSE outlining procedures to be followed before works are carried out.
 - o I have pointed this out and have sent copies to these rangers.
 - Pressure is also being applied for all rangers in charge and forest managers to get up to speed on the MOU.

Thank you to John for speaking at length on issues that affect us all as Four Wheel Drivers.

Other Business:

EFT:

Pat Casey asked whether it would be possible to pay membership fees and other club related payments via Electronic Funds Transfer. Whilst this may be possible we do not believe the club is currently registered for electronic banking. The issue will be addressed by the committee however it is unlikely that it will be available for the current renewal cycle. It was also pointed out that this may increase the workload for the treasurer.

Trip Clarification

Clarification was sought regarding the level of Approval required before a trip could be considered a "Club" trip. The following clarifications were settled upon:

- Trips do not need to be approved by the trip coordinator but he must be notified in order for the trip to be considered a "Club" trip.
- Trips may be submitted either via Trip Data Form, Yahoo Group or informally however see above to be considered a "Club Trip"
- Trips should be reviewed where necessary at committee level to ensure that the trip was within capabilities of the trip leader.
- If absolutely necessary approval for a trip may be withdrawn if the committee feel that the trip may in anyway expose the participants to an unacceptable level of risk e.g. trip being lead into a high/extreme fire risk area.

STEAMED LEMON CAKE

3 eggs

3/4 cup caster sugar

75 g butter melted

2 tablespoons double thick cream

2 lemons, with the rind finely grated...and juiced

1 cup plain flour

1/2 teaspoon baking powder

LEMON CREAM

1/2 cup lemon curd 200ml double thick cream

Grease and line 6 cm deep, 22cm springform pan Using an electric mixer, beat eggs and sugar on high speed for about 4 minutes, or til thick and pale. Stir in lemon rind, cream, butter, and 1/2 cup lemon juice.

Sift flour and baking powder together over egg mixture. Gently fold into batter.

Spread into prepared pan and smooth the surface. Place pan in a large steamer basket over a wok of simmering water.

Cover with lid or foil.

Top up water in wok to almost reach the base of the steamer basket.

Steam over low heat for 30 minutes, or until a skewer inserted into the centre comes out clean.

MAKING LEMON CREAM

Combine lemon curd and cream in a bowl...whisk till well combined....

then...run a knife around the edge of the cake pan, release pan side...slice cake and serve with a dollop of the lemon cream...

mmm yummy....enjoy..

Sunday 19th February

After an easy start to the day, re-capping on some of the things we did on the Saturday, and working out what the trainees would like to go over. The main objectives were to have some more practise on the stall recovery technique in both going up and down hill.



We headed up Lukes Ck Tk, diverting up the steep rocky section that we traversed on the previous day. At the top we turned in a northeast direction and then right onto a disused tramway track that is carved through the hillside. This is an interesting little track that has a clearing where there probably was a steam-powered winch used to pull up the trams loaded with timber in the early days. It is a little tight through here, but is a great drive, having to place your vehicle in the right position to avoid a fallen tree. At the end of this we turned to the left and headed back down part of Lukes Ck Tk and down a rocky/ledgy section to the main road. From here we headed off to an un-named track that used to have a good muddy section at the end, but unfortunately this track has been permanently closed with a massive tree dropped over the track.

We then headed around to Eszter Tk and Gutter Ck Rd, which both turned out to be very easy. We did get to use the winch and snatch block though, to remove a fallen tree blocking our progress.

Next up was an un-named track that headed down to the powerlines and the Melba Hwy. There was a great little section where the guys got to practise their stall recovery down hill.

Further along we came to a section where we had to descend a short steep section then turn left into a bog hole. We all hopped out and discussed the best way to proceed and checked the depth of the bog hole which we found to be quite shallow with a firm base. The guys grabbed their cameras and watched while I showed them the way around.

Every one made it look easy, with Craig showing how good wheel placement can make up for his smaller wheels by straddling the ruts out of the bog hole. We then made our way to the Melba Hwy and found a clearing to air up our tyres.

From all accounts, every one had a great time having gained some invaluable knowledge and a greater appreciation of what they, and their vehicle, can do.



Post script

During the review of the training weekend, it has become apparent that it is impossible to cover all aspects of driver training in a single weekend.

What we plan to do in the future, is to try and cover as best as possible the main conditions/tracks that we more often find ourselves on. ie: Steep and rocky tracks and some muddy sections. So far I have done around 6 recce trips to try and sort out a circuit of tracks suitable, but still find ourselves wanting for some more. Hopefully this will be sorted out before the next training weekend.

I will be running a few 'specialized' training trips over the

I will be running a few 'specialized' training trips over the next 2 years covering water crossings (in the high country on Cup Weekend), Snow driving and sand driving and possibly in the dunes at Portland. Watch out for these trips as they are shaping up to be something special.



George's Kimberley Adventure

<u>Just to let you know</u> Jan and I have returned from George Pledger's trip.

Towing our off-road caravan and setting out on April 22, we travelled to Broken Hill via Mildura before driving into SA and up the Oodnadatta Track to Marla. The track was no problem for a 4WD or a 2WD car, but there were some rocky sections after William Creek where we took it a bit more steadily because of the van. Being an off-roader, it meant we could take it on to some bush tracks beside the road to make camp at night. We stopped for the night at Beresford Siding and about half-way between Oodnadatta and Marla.

We made contact with the rest of the group (George, Brian, Graeme & Sue) who had left a week later than us, by SMS at Marla and hoped to meet up with them. We didn't know it at the time, but we were one to two hours ahead of them on the road. We camped at Trephina Gorge in the East MacDonnell Range for 3 nights while the rest of the group explored Ulura, the Olgas, Kings Canyon and the West Macdonnells. We'd been there last year so didn't venture back. As we didn't hear from the others, we headed north again hoping to stay three or four nights at the 12 Mile Yards campground in Mataranka to wait for the others to catch up with us. Disappointingly, it was closed - due to flood damage the notice said, although we heard later that saltwater crocodiles had been sighted nearby in the Roper River.

We stayed a night at the Homestead Caravan Park instead but it was too noisy so we went on to Katherine (where salties has been seen in the gorge) and then to Gregory N.P. where we had arranged by SMS to meet the others.

They arrived a couple of days later and we joined them to go to Keep River NP, Kununurra, where left the van in storage, and El Questro. It was while we were there that we heard the road into the Mitchell Plateau was closed, so the group reluctantly decided to adopt Plan B which was to come back out of the Gibb River Road eastwards, go around the Great Northern Highway to Derby and Broome and then eastwards along the Gibb River Road and on to the Mitchell Plateau once the King Edward River had fallen and the flow was slower.

Unfortunately for Jan and I, that route would take too long so we travelled down to the Bungle Bungles with the group where a check with Drysdale confirmed the river was down a bit (700mm) but still flowing fast. When we left, and they headed south and west, we drove back to Kununurra, picked up the van and continued eastwards over the next 12 days to the Queensland coast via the Victoria, Buntine, Buchanan, Stuart and Barkly Highways, stopping for 2 or 3 nights each at Mount Isa, Winton and Longreach.

After the long trip - 3,864 km - we stopped at Yeppoon and Emu Park for a couple of weeks before heading home via Coolum Beach on the Sunshine Coast and then the New England and Newell Highways.

While we missed the main objective - the Mitchell Plateau - we still managed to visit a number of places we hadn't been to before and had good fun, although virtually no 4WDriving.

I'm looking forward to reading the trip report from the others, especially once they made it on to the Gibb River Road and the Plateau.
