



Here is a recipe I am sure you will enjoy...

MANGO CHICKEN CURRY

- 1 tablespoon oil
- 4 chicken thigh cutlets
- 4 drumsticks
- 1 red onion sliced
- 1 red capsicum sliced
- 2 cloves of garlic, crushed
- 2 tablespoons finely grated ginger
- 2 tablespoons chicken gravy powder
- 1/4 cup chicken stock
- 2 tablespoons brown sugar
- 1 400g can of mango slices, drained and chopped
- 1and a half tablespoons mild curry powder
- 2 cups of water
- 2/3 cup sultanas
- Heat oil in a large fry pan and cook chicken over a medium high heat for 10 minutes till well browned.
- Remove from heat, and set aside.
- Add onion and capsicum to pan, and cook for 3 minutes.
- Add garlic, curry powder and ginger and cook for a further minute.
- Return chicken to pan.

Stubbie Holders

 Combine gravy mix, concentrated chicken stock, water and brown sugar, and pour over chicken.
 Bring to the boil, reduce heat, cover and simmer for 25 minutes, stirring occasionally. Add sultanas and mango pieces, and cook for a further 5 minutes, stirring occasionally until sauce has thickened, and the chicken is cooked through

Serve with steamed rice.. Hope you all enjoy this

minute chaos trying to re-organize things. Thanks everyone for their patience while I decided whether to change the destination and then find a new one.



The fire was put out by the CFA 500 metres from the side of my house. In front of the house the fire continued on it's aggressive path just 400 metres from the house. As you can tell we were very lucky. When you looked from the veranda all you could see was black.

The damage that has been caused up here is incredible, however I still have a house.
