

- appoint an auditor



Italian Beef

- 1/2 to 4 pounds beef roast, sirloin tip or rump roast
- 12 ounces (jar) Italian Giardiniera, drained, less if you want it less spicy
- 12 ounces (jar) pepperoncini peppers
- 1 envelope Italian salad dressing (zesty Italian)
- 10 ounce can condensed beef broth

PREPARATION:

Place beef roast in a 3 1/2 to 5-quart slow cooker. Combine Giardiniera, pepperoncini peppers, dry salad dressing mix, and condensed beef broth.

Add all mixture to crockpot. Cover and cook on LOW for 12 to 14 hours, until meat is very tender.

- Trips may be submitted either via Trip Data Form, Yahoo Group or informally however see above to be considered a "Club Trip"
- Trips should be reviewed where necessary at committee level to ensure that the trip was within capabilities of the trip leader.
- If absolutely necessary approval for a trip may be withdrawn if the committee feel that the trip may in anyway expose the participants to an unacceptable level of risk e.g. trip being lead into a high/extreme fire risk area.
