

# EASY BAKED BEANS PIE



## Ingredients

2 tablespoons oil
1 onion, finely chopped
1 carrot, diced
2 celery stalks, diced
1 leek, finely sliced
400g beef mince
420 can Heinz Boston Bull Mean Beanz
8 sheets filo pastry
40g butter, melted

## Method

Preheat oven to 220oC or200C fan. Heat oil in a large frying pan on medium. Cook onion, carrot, celery and leek for 10 minutes, stirring, until soft. Add mince and cook on high for 5 minutes, stirring to break up lumps, until brown. Add beans and ¼ cup water and season to

dish or four 1¼ cup ramekins.

Stack four sheets of filo, brushing with melted butter between each layer.

Roll up loosely and cut into 1cm strips. Repeat with remaining filo sheets and butter.

Loosen pastry slightly with fingers and place over bean mixture.

Bake for 10 minutes, until golden and heated through.

Serve hot.

Today was another of the monthly clean up days at Gembrook Forest organised by James at 3rd Rock 4wd Club; members of Vic Crawlers club were also in attendance.

A large group were found having coffee and donuts when I arrived at the designated meeting spot - BP Longwarry Northside. I thought I was early at 8:20am but Tim had organised for the others to meet at 8:00am, so I was actually late. In attendance were 7 cars, 6 Nissans and a lone Cruiser: Mark and Catherine, Tim and kids, Johan and family, Garry, Shane, Craig and co and myself. Anyway, with the promise of a sunny but windy day, we headed off for Dyers Picnic ground to meet the other clubs. Tim asked if I could lead the group into the designated point as I was familiar with the area. Familiar, yeah, still took wrong turns, yeah. When we arrived at Gentle Annie Picnic ground, I realised I had taken the wrong fork in the road.

Nevertheless, I led the group up Gentle Annie Tk (Tim's idea) and I was the first casualty. It was quite clear the conditions were not going to allow most of us up and it was not worth trying any further, so we all reversed out.
