



Chicken and Corn Cakes

Ingredients

2 cobs corn

400g chicken breast fillets, roughly chopped

2 spring onions, finely chopped

2 kaffir lime leaves, finely sliced

1 egg white

1 tbsp sweet chilli sauce

11/2 tbsp fish sauce

¼ cup chopped coriander sea salt and cracked black pepper peanut oil for shallow frying

Method

Place corn in a large saucepan of boiling water and simmer for 1-2 minutes. Drain and cool. Cut the kernels from the cobs (you should have about 1½ cups of corn kernels). Place chicken, corn, onion, kaffir lime leaves, egg white, chilli sauce, fish sauce, coriander, salt and pepper in a food processor and process until combined.

Roll mixture into walnut-sized balls and flatten lightly. Place on a tray lined with non-stick baking paper.

To cook, heat oil in a large non-stick frying pan over medium-low heat. Add corn cakes and cook for 4 minutes each side until golden brown and cooked through.

Serve with extra sweet chilli sauce and green salad.

Tip:

When buying fresh corn on the cob, look for bright green, tight fitting husks and golden brown silk at the stem. The corn kernels should be plump with a milky-coloured juice and form an even layer over the cob.

Media Release

Graves discovered and marked after fires

The Great Divide fires of 2006-07 caused much devastation, but also uncovered some significant historic relics such as mines, old house sites, machinery and ancient bridle tracks. One of the most important finds has been grave sites in the Aberfeldy River catchment, north of Erica.

DSE Forest Ranger, Noel Lees was shown a lone grave at Merringtons, 23 kilometres north of Erica earlier this year and said that one of the pleasing things that stood out to him about the site was the quartz rocks that had been placed around the grave.

Mr Lees became interested in learning more about these sites and visited Edwards Reef cemetery on Donnellys Creek Road, 27 kilometres north of Walhalla.

"To my astonishment I found at least another nine grave sites there, visible after the fires, which I realised would be lost once the vegetation had grown back, so, remembering the grave at Merringtons I thought I would do something about it," he said.

"I also had a look at Toombon cemetery, east of the Aberfeldy Road on Donnellys Creek Road, where I found at least another fourteen graves. I spoke to Graeme Code who is the Trustee of both the cemeteries and suggested placing quartz rocks on the graves to mark them and show respect for their sites."

Mr Code agreed this would be a great idea, so Noel Lees followed up by asking the Victorian Four Wheel Drive Club if they would be interested in helping to mark the graves at Edwards Reef and Toombon with quartz rocks.

'This club has helped DSE with other projects over the years and members are always keen to be involved in community projects," Mr Lees said.

The Four Wheel Drive Club members were happy to help and in late July, on a very frosty morning 20 people had gathered around a blazing fire at the Merrington campgrounds.

"Once every one had warmed up, we headed for Edwards Hill along Williamson Spur Road to a site where early in the week I had found a lot of quartz rocks. Within an hour we had a trailer full and made our way to Edwards Reef cemetery."

"Everyone pitched in, including the kids and the dog and we collected large rocks for the head of the graves and smaller ones to mark the foot.

The group then headed for Toombon Cemetery to repeat the exercise.

Toombon settlement once had a population of up to 1500 people and the cemetery was gazetted in 1870. There are up to 44 known graves here, situated on very steep ground just west of Toombon.

"When I first came to Erica in 1979, the graves at Toombon cemetery were marked, but over the years souvenir hunters have taken all the markers," Mr Lees said.

The steepness of the ground at Toombon and the distance between the graves meant that marking them took a bit longer, but a chain gang was formed and soon made light work of the task.

"I have to say that in the 29 years I have been working for DSE this was most satisfying task I've done and both the cemeteries look great with their new markers," Mr Lees said.

Mr Lees thanked John Partridge and all the other members of the Victorian Four Wheel Drive Club on behalf of the department for their help in restoring two historic sites.

"The work that they've done will be enjoyed by other people for hundreds of years to come, I am sure," he said
