

Moorish Lamb Cutlets with Preserved Lemon Yoghurt and Gremolata



INGREDIENTS

- 1 teaspoon cumin seeds
- 2 teaspoons ground coriander
- 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 1 teaspoon ground turmeric
- 2 tablespoons lemon juice
- 12 (480g) French-trimmed lamb cutlets sea salt flakes and freshly ground pepper
- 1 (40g) preserved lemon wedge, rind only, chopped finely
- 1 tablespoon finely chopped fresh parsley

Preserved Lemon Yogurt

- 1 cup (280g) Greek-style yogurt
- 2 teaspoons lemon juice
- 1 (40g) preserved lemon wedge, rind only, chopped finely

METHOD

Combine spices and lemon juice in a bowl to form a paste. Rub cutlets with paste; cover and refrigerate for 1 hour.

Preserved Lemon Yogurt
Meanwhile, combine yoghurt, juice and lemon in a small bowl.

Cook the lamb cutlets on a heated, oiled barbecue (or grill or grill pan) until browned on both sides and cooked as desired. Season with sea salt flakes and freshly ground pepper.

Serve topped with Preserved Lemon Yogurt and sprinkled with combined chopped preserved lemon and parsley.

> TECHNICAL COMMENTARY "PATROL CAMBER SOLUTION"

Well, just under a month to go before we start the Nullarbor trip. Fuel prices have come down, except diesel which at least should not have gone up. The weather is always the great unknown so I can't control that. What I can control is the readiness of my vehicle.

For the last few months my truck, a 1990 GQ patrol, has suffered from a terrible shaking when driving over 70-80 km/h. It also had a very high pitched vibration starting at about the same speed. Tried nearly everything after listening to just about everyone. Check the front wheel bearings came a suggestion. First off tightened them, no difference, so I then replaced them. At that stage it was a thank goodness, as I found that I had water in the bearings and also the front diff. It was a recent ingress and in this case I caught it before any damage, apart from replacing the bearings and all the oil but it could have been much worse and also much more expensive.

Next suggestion was the tyres are out of balance. Checked and balanced. No difference. Rotate the tyres. No difference. Replace the tyres. I was running on 32" x 10.5" x 15" "Mudstar" mud terrains. About 30% gone but still very good in the mud. Replaced them with 31" x 10.5" x 15" Hankook All Terrains. This brand was already on the vehicle when I purchased it, ran well, great on road, very good off road, except for real muddy conditions. No difference. Still a real nasty shake from the steering wheel when going over 70 km/h as well as the vibration.

I have a contact in the wrecking industry who told me that they have seen this vibration so bad that they have had to wreck the vehicle because they could not fix it. Didn't sound good.

I then spoke to yet another person who said that he also had the same problem and that a person in Sydney has developed a fix and the only place to get it done in Victoria is at Pro-Axle in Campbellfield. I contacted Wayne at Pro-Axle and arranged to get the vehicle over to them. Delivered on a Monday afternoon, got a call with the examination on Tuesday showing that the problem was one of the worst they had ever seen, but it could be fixed. The bad vibration through the vehicle was from the front and rear universal joints in the front drive shaft which were absolutely stuffed and needed replacing. I was told that many mechanics, especially those who do not specialise in 4WD can sometimes misdiagnose these universal joints. They can sometimes give them a twist, think that they are OK because they feel tight when in fact they are seized. If you can check them yourself or if you do a lot of off roading, ensure that the joints take grease and keep them full.

As for the steering vibration, yes, they can fix it with a camber adjustment kit and some shims. Exactly how this is done cannot be put in print and if told further communication cannot be made.

The end result. What a delight to drive. Up to and over the 100 km/h mark without a problem. No vibration through the vehicle thanks to the new uni joints. No steering vibration thanks to the camber adjustment kit. When the vehicle had previously hit a pothole and severely shaken its head, nothing. Back to the vehicle I had originally. Cost? Not cheap. Over \$1,200 but there were a few problems. Better than going to Halls 4x4 and asking for a wrecking
