

Roadworthy - John sold his car with a 2 inch body lift, 2 inch suspension plus 33" tyres. A lot of places will not roadworthy anything with more than 2" combined lift. Adjustable panhards are not roadworthy either. Although this is not yet law it looks like it has been tacitly adopted. The association have missed the last 2 meetings. ARB et all have been assured that this is not yet law. John spoke to Vic Roads and Roadworthy have been advised to go off Aus Std which is the 2" max or go by Vic Rule which is 2/3 original suspension travel. Possible agreement will be 2" suspension plus 1" tyres (i.e. from 31" to 33" is OK), combined. Anything else will need to be engineered. This is a bit of a minefield. Watch this space.

We will try to get a response from the Association on what is happening with this.

# IN MEMORIAM

#### Lynton "Bluey" Male - 26 November 1924 - 12 July 2010

The VFWDC recently lost one of its founding members – Bluey Male – an important part of the Club's history.

Most members would be unaware who Bluey was, but those who had the privilege to meet him would appreciate that his travel knowledge and history will be greatly missed. To help members understand more about Bluey, Don and Thelma Montague have compiled a small account of his achievements.

Bluey married his childhood sweetheart, Joyce, at the tender age of 23 years and did what seems an impossibility with the youth of today and stayed happily married to Joyce for 62 years.

Bluey served in the RAAF as a Mechanic during WW2 at a secret "Bomber Base" located at Truscott W.A. Kimberley area that was used to bomb Japanese island fuel depots with much success. Now a staging point for oil exploration supply. As the only surviving member, he was invited back by the Historical Society - wined and dined along with a group of friends who fly choppers that gained entry through their connection with Bluey. Another big highlight in his life.

He was one of the founding members of the Victorian Four Wheel Drive Club.

- Bluey was an avid traveller and had been to Cape York, Arnhem Land, The Kimberley, Canning Stock Route, Victorian High Country, Thursday Island, Tiwi Islands, Gun Barrell Highway to name a few. One of the earliest ventures was to "sneak" into Surveyor Generals Corner without being noticed. Much more exciting than paying at the turnstile! He was a great lover of desert travel and crossed the Simpson Desert at least 11 times, visited all the "Corner Posts" on a number of occasions – regretting that he never traversed the Madigan Line. His final "trip" was with Joyce, Thelma and Don on the Ghan which he thoroughly enjoyed – picking out likely camping spots as we rattled along. He travelled most roads before they were sealed – sand, snow, mountains, deserts. Had a map of Australia on the wall with roads and tracks traversed that looked like a spider's web. It was a big challenge to find a track he had not been on and a great delight for him to add it to the web.
- Bluey was always a wealth of knowledge in organising trips and especially helpful when the trip leader would be "lost"; he would come up with a bit of past knowledge that would reassure the party that they were going the "right way"
- He always carried a diary of trips, noting who was in the party and what problems occurred, such as breakdowns. Don Montague has a lot of entries. He used these notes to compile causes of breakdowns so as to know what tools and spares to carry.
- Working as a motor mechanic on cars, motor cycles, chain saws made him very adept at inventing gadgets, eg rooftop bed on a Shorty, cooking equipment, beadbreaker etc that made four wheel driving more functional. All the things the new generation of travellers take for granted.
- He started touring in a VW with his wife Joyce and two daughters Julie and Sue travelling to Darwin, crossing the Nullabour on unsealed roads.
- Other than four wheel driving, Bluey was also an avid fisherman having a number of boats. Duck shooting was his great love. He only missed one season in 40 or more years that was cancelled, until he was too weak to travel in the last two years. His pool room is adorned with many trophies showing his skill as a clay / trap shooter.

It was considered an honour to be included in a trip with the Trio – Vin Handley, Bill Mc Kinnon, Bluey Male – as your vehicle, temperament, experience, compatibility were evaluated to make a well planned trip excitingly successful. Thank you Blue.

As you can see from these achievements he lived a fulfilling life and will be a greatly missed by the Club.
