

Robe SA Trip Report Cup Day Long Weekend 2011

Lynelle and I arrived about 11:00am Saturday after

greeted at the entrance of the campsite by the rest of the gang. Where we spent a little while setting up the camper and shower and later we went out with the group for a look down towards Carpenter's Rocks. It was now that we had to don the 'Sand Flag'! These came in all shapes and sizes and construction methods from factory, to conduit and hi-vis vests, even a surf rod with hi-vis vest fitted! No there no major issues on this trip as the sand was generally quite firm. We headed back to camp to finish setting up and have some camp dinner.

Morning came for a gathering of bacon and eggs for breakfast. We hadn't been out on a trip with Johan before and didn't realise breakfast is only a small event, with the main morning meal BRUNCH being around 11. We got hungry waiting so headed back to the camper for our own eggs and bacon. After the group had all eaten, we packed the cars for lunch and headed out to Beachport Tourist Centre for some maps. Our journey took us out past Lake George before airing down and hopping straight out onto the sand! Following the sandy track around we came across the first of challenges - a big wide sand dune, which we all took turns at going up forwards, backwards and anyway we could. Fast, slow, crawl, you name it. The Parks Ranger was active in the local area and found an unregistered motorbike that pulled up just near us to exchange details with the ranger.

We were on the way off to find a spot for lunch which we did end up finding a nice spot. Just before pulling up, my driver found a nice big puddle which clearly had her name on it. She headed through it at a speed which managed to soak me, the front seat, the back seat and all of it's contents, including her handbag. Nice one!

After lunch, we followed the tracks around and finally, down onto the beach. We headed off, some a little faster than others, but then we came to where the sand got deeper and deeper and the



car got slower and slower, not for the lack of RPM though. Anyway, within a short few minutes, this found all 5 cars sunk down in the sand, with Colin's 80 series the closest to the water with the waves gently kissing his tyres. Lucky the tide was on its way out as the waves were licking up against Colin's wheels!

Anyway, we hooked up the front of the Pathfinder to the back of the 80 Series and gently pulled it out. Mighty Pathfinders! Looking into the distance we saw Johan bogged down in the sand which he eventually got out of. Then behind us, both Lewis and Steve were also bogged down in the sand. Once Johan was out, he drove back to us and went down into the deep sand again. Steve brought his "2 Max Trax" along which helped greatly. Except, after the recovery, there was only 1 Max Trax! We dug for ages, but still only 1. While searching for the Max Trax, we could hear 2 cars in the distance heading towards us at a great rate of knots. They both went past on the water side of our cars which was cutting it a bit thin, but they got through and we never saw them again. Finally, we were able to turn all cars back around to head

back the way we came and off the deep sand. Our next entry point to the beach greeted us with about 8 cars, 3 of which were bogged at various points on the soft sand.

We waited for



a gap in the traffic and headed down onto the beach, at a better rate of knots and made it up to the next exit point where we stopped for some photos.

After a few more beach runs, we came across a small fishing village - Nora Creine. The village was all but deserted, maybe the fishing was good! Those who have been through here will understand.

We were all now back on the beach on the final leg back to Robe. Back in April this year, my wife and I chose not to do these few stretches of beach as the sign said "Deep Soft Sand" and we were by ourselves. This time was different, we were apart of a group of 5, what could go wrong? Well, nothing, we had experienced our recovery session earlier. The sand was very deep and we had to keep on it and keep the eyes open. Finally, we arrived back into Robe where we aired up and a had a look around before heading back to camp for dinner. Monday morning, we started off with breakfast and a had a general lazy day. Lewis and Adrianna headed back to Melbourne, Colin headed off by himself for a tour around, Steve and Nicole also headed off to take the kids to the park at Millicent. I took Lynelle for a look around Southend and while we were on the hill near the jetty, we saw 3 cars head off on the beach towards Beachport. I hadn't done this stretch before so we headed off in pursuit of the new adventure. We found the entry to the beach, where we quickly aired down and headed off. Lynelle was driving and I encouraged her to put the foot down a little more as the car seemed to be bogging down slowly. She obliged and whilst tricky, she did manage to keep the car moving and on top of the sand for the whole stretch to Beachport. We found the exit point rather suddenly and headed into town. Whist looking around, Johan rang to see if I could buy a Helicoil kit as he had some issues with the Patrol.

Unlucky in Beachport, we went back to camp and picked up Johan before heading into

Millicent to the parts shop. We got back to camp and Johan had nearly the whole intake system off his car, along with all the rocker gear. We fitted the Helicoils x 2 and fitted everything back on to the engine, helped by Johan's young son Armando. The engine fired first kick and he was back in business in no time at all. Results, 2 rocker gear threads stripped!

Lynelle and I had the camper packed Monday night, we then slept in the swag for an early morning departure for long journey home. We were on the way home by 6:30am, shortly followed by Colin, Steve and Nicole. Johan and his family were staying for the rest of the week.
