





<u>Friday</u>

I had a good day at work, Mark had received a call and was advised that Steve P & Ben were heading up earlier; we didn't have to rush as much. Mark had gone home to meet Steve; I had made it almost half way home, when I had forgotten to grab the maps from work. I returned to work, collected the maps & headed home again. The boys had finished packing the car, I grabbed a few more things & then we headed off. We stopped for dinner along the way & headed out to Mansfield. The rain had been falling since mid afternoon, we had literally got to the bottom of the black spur & it had completed stopped. We were planning to stop at the BP in Mansfield, but they had already shut up for the night. Thankfully we had enough fuel for the return trip, so headed to Sheepyard Flat. We picked up Steve P over the UHF; where we found them huddled around a small fire. The fire was stoked, camp was set & we sat around the campfire for a little bit, then headed off to bed.

Saturday

We woke up, Steve P & Ben decided to have a sleep in, till around 9am, Steve & I took a walk & took some photos. We packed up & headed off to Upper Jamieson Hut, the track down to the Hut was different to when we had been there 3 weeks ago. It had only been recently graded & with the latest down pouring of rain, it was a mess. The grading of the track wasn't needed, as the track was fine last time.

We got down to the Hut, with a few vehicles & guys there. We stopped & chatted with them, took a look inside the Hut, where some people had lodged & the fire was roaring with warmth. We said the guys could join us later at Lovicks. We continued on, passed alot of hunters who were stationed along the track. The tracks up to Lovicks were also changed from 3 weeks ago. We didn't stop for lunch as we were so close to Lovicks, we saw plenty of fallen wood, so decided to stop & grab some along the way. We eventually got to Lovicks; a group effort of starting the fire was successful. Ben, Steve P & Mark went & collected some more wood for the night, while Steve & I tended to the fire.

That's when the guys from Upper Jamieson Hut rocked up; they too had seen the hunters. But they were held up, where the hunters finally got their prize. The guys had a whole leg of a very young buck in one of the cars. It looked like a good bit of meat, a peace offering of them having to wait for awhile for the kill. All of a sudden most of the guys "cracked" out their mobile phones, checking voicemail boxes & were making phone calls. I asked them if they "had to check in with their misses", because it was like they couldn't be without their mobile phones, for a few days. They headed back to the Lovicks property down near Sheepyard Flat.

The fire was roaring, & we had plenty of wood to keep us warm for the night. Mark & Steve went for a drive, to where we been to the look out before, but the fog was rolling in & it wasn't long before the boys returned, as they had already locked the gate up on the track. We had dinner as night fell, & it looked like it was going to rain, but before long the fog & cloud had rolled through, making way for a clear starry night sky, that lay out above us.

This made the temperature drop dramatically. Steve had set up himself inside the Hut, which was a wise choice. Stories were shared around the campfire, I remember falling asleep for a short time, Chorizo's & drinks were consumed at 11pm. Finally we decided to go to bed at some early hour of the morning, we went to get in the tent & the zip on the fly was frozen & it made it interesting climbing into bed.

Sunday

Some of us had risen early & others decided it was too cold & stayed in bed for a little while longer. Mark advised me that everything was covered with ice & a few things were frozen. We took awhile to have brekkie & pack up; it was 11:30am, before we headed off to the Bluff Hut. Then up Sixteen Mile Spur Track to Circuit Road, this is where we said good-bye to Ben & Steve P, who headed down the hill & we headed up monument Track, to Craig's Hut. Mark & Steve headed off to Craig's Hut & took some photos, while I had a short nap in the warm car. We headed down Circuit Road, along the bit that was closed last time & saw alot of damage from the heavy rains a few months ago & alot of huge landslides. We returned home later than expected. Thanks Mark for running your first trip; it was definitely a good one to remember.

Trainee Driving Instructors Required

They must have completed a Proficiency Level Driver Training Course or similar course, and provide evidence that they understand the basic snatch strap recovery technique. Additionally the need to provide evidence that they have the ability to present a theory session under the direct supervision of an accredited instructor, and then be formally nominated by their club on the required ETU Trainee Nomination Form.

General Rusiness:

Amendment to the Club Constitution - Definition of Membership

Proposed: Paul Ryan Seconded: Ashley Martin

Paul Ryan presented an amendment to the Constitution regarding the definition of membership in response to previous enquiries regarding Honorary Memberships from Club members. The Committee of Management have revised the categories of Membership of the Victorian Four Wheel Drive Club Inc. as defined in the Constitution and this was presented to the membership as follows:

- (8) There shall be three (3) classes of Member of the Association:
 - (a) Ordinary Member, comprising Single (Ordinary) Member and Family (Ordinary) Member. An Ordinary Member is defined as an active member of the club who, having paid their application fee and membership fee, is an affiliated member of the Association. Ordinary members have full voting rights and may occupy positions on the Committee of Management. Ordinary members are affiliated members of Four Wheel Drive Victoria and as such a portion of the membership fee is required to cover the costs of affiliation and insurance costs.
 - (b) Silver Member. A Silver Member is an active member of the club who has had 25 years continuous membership with the Association. In recognition of this the Committee of Management waives the membership fee for the Victorian Four Wheel Drive Club Inc. for these members. The member is not a financial member of the Association and therefore has no voting rights and may not occupy a position on the Committee of Management. The member continues to be an affiliated member of Four Wheel Drive Victoria and must pay the associated affiliation fee and insurance costs. A Silver Member may, if they so decide, continue to be recognized as Financial Member of the Association by paying their membership fee. Payment of the fee entitles them to full voting rights and allows them to nominate for and occupy positions on the Committee Management, if they so wish.
 - (c) Gold Member (formerly known as Honorary Member). A Gold Member is an inactive member of the Association who was formerly recognized as an Honorary Member. Gold Members are non financial members of the Association and do not have voting rights nor may they occupy a position on the Committee of Management. Gold

Members are inactive and therefore are not affiliated members of Four Wheel Drive Victoria. Gold Members are not required to pay affiliation fees and insurance costs. Gold Membership may be bestowed on a member at the instigation of the Committee of Management.

The amendment was put to the vote of the membership present at the meeting and was carried unanimously.

The amendment will be included in the Constitution.
