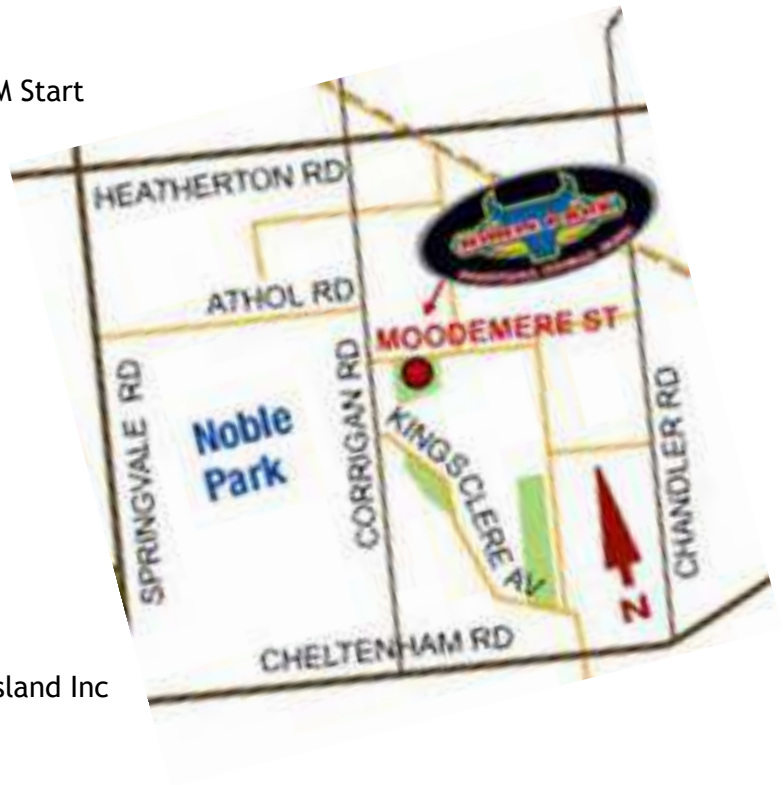

Trip Reports

A weekend in the snow.

This weekend was amazing!!!! We headed off Friday where we camped at Jamieson Friday night, we arrived late and set up in the dark. After a quick set up, we all sat by the camp fire and talked about the up coming day. Saturday was a morning full of excitement and anticipation, after some breakfast Stu and Maree joined us at camp at 9am. By 9:30am we were on our

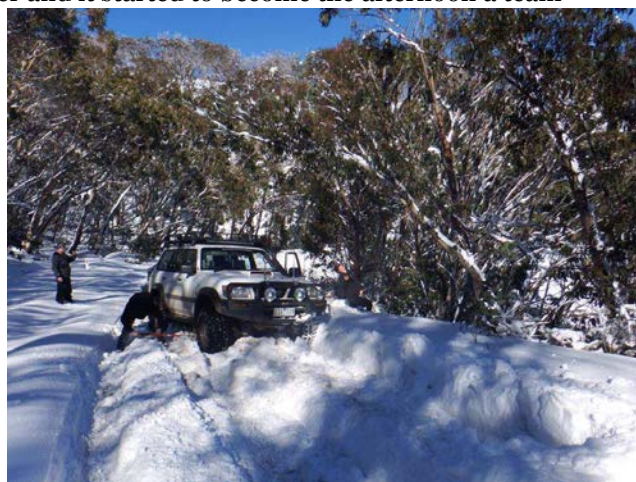


way with a stop at Jamieson for some hot 'real' coffee and some photos. Once we were all ready

we got back in our trucks and headed to Mt Skene. We aired down as soon as it was safe to do so. climbing the mounting was exciting for everyone, as the recent heavy snow fall made the track conditions unpredictable. Mark was the first to get stuck and needed to be snatched out by Sally and Tristan. Meaning Sally and Tristan had to take lead. Then Sally and Mick got stuck and then Ly in the same spot as Sally and Mick, this was just the start of a day full of recoveries and team work. Sally and Tristan were leading and making new tracks in virgin snow. This was when we were driving inch by inch in snow up to our knees. We were getting close to the summit when Mark took the lead while the boys (Sam's group) came down to help plough some of the snow. At this point Mark needed to go around the boys coming down the mountain and the boys needed to turn around. That's when Mark and the boys got stuck. Leaving the other trucks with nowhere to go but wait and help recover. After a few hours of trying to recover and it started to become the afternoon a team meeting was called and a plan was discussed within the team that we were going to turn around and go back to camp. Sounds simple



right. This involved a number of people taking turns to dig 700-800cm that was safe for all vehicles' to turn around safely (by doing a 20 point turn), however while this was going on the recoveries were still being attended with Mark and the boys and Brett had also found himself stuck and required a lot of help to get out including a drag chain from Lys car to Mick car (who was behind Ly) and a snatch strap from Mick's car to Stu's car (Stu's car was behind Mick's car on the left and then a winch and winch extension to Brett's car (which was all the way over to the right behind Stu's car). Brett also required to be pushed out by Sally, Emily, Maree, Darna and





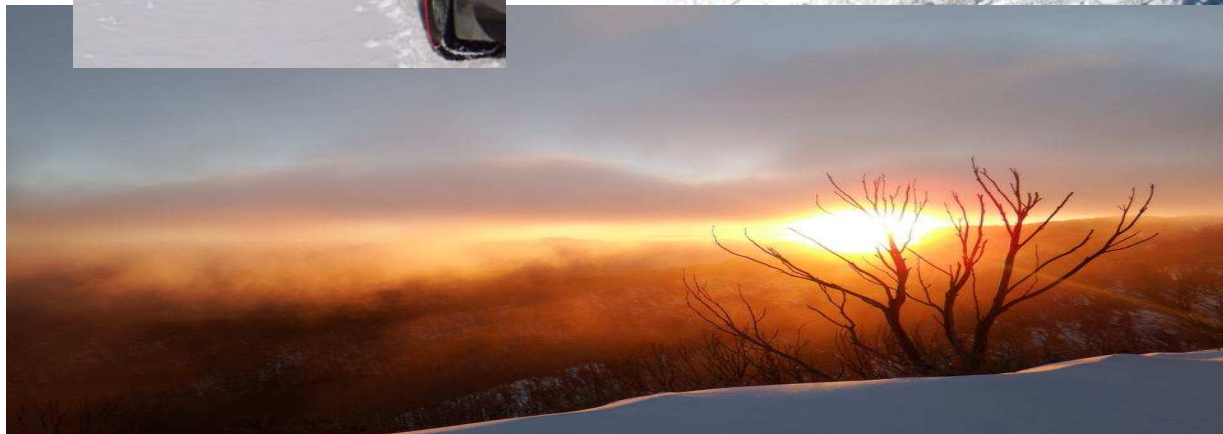
by this time, Mark and Steve had made it to the summit and were winching downhill through the snow to get back to us, when we received a radio call from Mark saying Steve had hurt himself and mark was stuck and needed another pair of hands to help get him out. Tristan and Amanda took torches and a medical kit and walked about 400m up the hill to meet the boys. It was thought that Steve was able to sit in the car till we made it back to camp and mark would take him to hospital for X-rays on his injured leg. Mark's car was free and Tristan Drove Steve's car back down the hill. While Amanda and Tristan were up the hill, Sally was organising what we all had in our cars if we needed to stay the night on the hill.

However, we made it back down the hill as a group and Scott was in the lead. By the time we left, the sun had set and it was getting cold. The track leading back to camp was very icy and we were lucky no one got stuck. We made it back to camp we all ate dinner and went to bed around 10:30pm as we were very tired from a full day of recoveries.



It has been estimated that this trip alone had over 20 recoveries and there was times people had to climb out of windows so they could get out of the car because the snow was so deep the car doors would not open.

There was still time to make snowmen and snow angels and have snowball fights. It was also a day of search and find the max tracks and shovels! Once all the cars were safely turned around the sun was starting to set and it began to become very cold. We've got a big thanks to Sally Higgs, Mick, Stu and Scott for your leadership and team work.

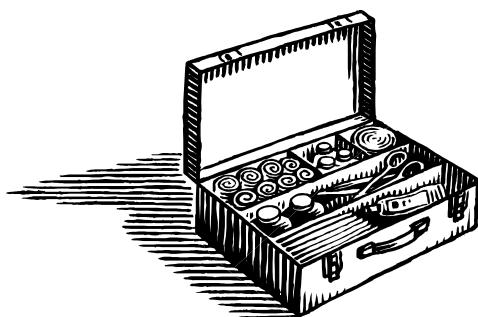
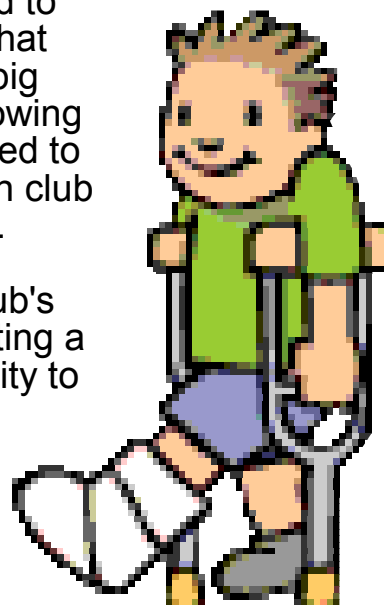

handle a variety of first aid situations (whether on club trips or in our other activities outside of the club).

The cost was quite reasonable at \$74 for our Club's members (thanks to David Bruinsma for negotiating a \$5 discount for those who attended) and the ability to complete the theory at our own pace from home made it very easy in the lead up to the day-long practical/practice sessions. I would highly recommend this course, particularly to anyone to regularly travels into isolated/remote areas of the bush.



We hope to arrange a session at some stage to enable club members to bring their first aid kits along to a meeting where we can go through people's kits, identify and talk about the more essential first aid items that suit our needs and activities, as well as the common first aid tools and techniques to be aware of when preparing, packing and maintaining your own kit.

We'd very much appreciate any feedback from members on your own thoughts and experiences, as well as whether you'd find such an evening to be of value for your own future trip planning and preparation needs.
