



Recall on Single Burner Gas Canister Stoves.

It has recently been brought to the attention of Four Wheel Drive Victoria regarding a number of incidents involving single burner butane cartridge stoves around the country. These problems appear to be across most brands and involve both the stove and the canister. The faults appear to stem from the mating between the stove and the canister and faulty sealing and also from a propensity to overheat causing the cartridge to rupture. The resultant flash/explosion/fire can cause severe injuries or death from shrapnel and/or burns. As a consequence of this, the NSW Department of Fair Trading has issued an immediate "Stop Sale" on these appliances, which requires the immediate withdrawal of all said stoves from shelves and a prohibition on their sale within New South Wales. Note that at the time of this being written, this does not apply anywhere else in the country. A sample of burners purchased off the shelf found an 84% failure rate on the shut-off valve/seal also called the over-pressure safety device. Due to this, approval of these stoves was withdrawn by AGA and SAI Global (the regulatory authorities). It is prohibited to sell any gas device in Australia whichdoes not have AGA/SAI Global approval. For those who have one of these stoves, and continue to use it, the following recommendations are made: do **NOT** use oversize pots and pans on the stove, as this may lead to overheating and failure; DO carefully inspect the cartridge valve assembly and the mating face of the stove and do NOT use if there is any damage; DO keep the mating points of the stove and cartridge free of dirt and debris to ensure a good seal; DO always ensure adequate airflow around the stove to reduce the likelihood of overheating; do **NOT** use on very hot days; and do **NOT** use the stove if you have any doubts about its safety or reliability. Fair Trading NSW urges that you do not use these stoves and advises that under Australian consumer law, you may be entitled to a refund if you can show proof of purchase. Please also note that while the above information applies to single burner stoves, a number of dual burner stoves are also on the market, and all fittings and parts relating to these faults are identical. Although no incidents have yet been reported involving dual burner stoves, the same warnings still apply.

From the Editorial:

This month sees our Association celebrate 40 years of representing the interests of Victorian four wheel driver drivers to preserve and promote responsible access to existing track networks on public lands.

The Victoria Association of Four Wheel Drive Clubs held its inaugural meeting on 20th February,1975. It was formed by seven clubs that saw the benefits of a united 4WD body. In a paper presented to the Institute of Foresters by Secretary Douglas Gardiner in 1978, he reported that by the 20th January, 1977 the individual member count was 842, which had grown to 1,785 by May 1978.

Today our membership both in Clubs and members has multiplied tenfold. It is impossible to even begin listing substantial projects, access fights and numerous activities that ensued over the last 40 years. Suffice to say - that like today - Victorian four wheel drivers have a wonderfully dedicated group of enthusiasts and volunteers to thank for

actively supporting and moving our Association on in a changing political and social environment, resulting in many wins for our recreation.

Accordingly, we are celebrating this auspicious occasion as only four wheelers can. Everyone loves a party, and this year we invite all four wheel drive clubs affiliated with FWD Victoria to spend the Queen's Birthday weekend in June together in Mansfield.

Celebrations will be centred at the Mansfield showgrounds where there are limited powered and unpowered campsites. Mansfield also has two commercial caravan parks, and a good variety of other accommodation options.

Hi Tony,


Could you please pass this on for Dave? I think he wanted it for the meeting or the magazine.


