

We kicked off the new year with a very interesting topic with guest speaker Paul Tsiaras from Statewide 4X4. Paul spoke at length about being able to increase the GVM of our 4x4's to help with the extra weight that we burden our vehicles with, when we start to add all the extras with 'just need to have' so we can safely go off road and go to hard to get at places. Statewide 4x4 have upgrades available for many models of 4x4's, both older models and the newer models. Paul also explained the process that they need to go through with testing of components to their breaking point before they are able to certify a vehicles new GVM. Also explained on the night is the difference between trying to upgrade a vehicle already registered, vrs upgrading a vehicle prior to initial registration at time of new vehicle purchase. It is really interesting to look into if you are in the position of looking at what prices for the make and model you are looking at, and what a new GVM would be with their kits installed.

As a committee, we are committed to try to bring you interesting speakers to our general meetings as frequently as we can make suitable arrangements, but this month we will focus on our normal general meeting and allow plenty of time to discuss the upcoming trips and trips since Christmas. Letter to the editor: RE: VASS on long rang fuel tanks

In light of the talk at the February meeting (I didn't attend but have been asked about this) from Paul at Statewide 4x4 regarding long rang fuel tanks and VASS certification, I have conducted some research into the matter.

Vicroads have produced a Guide to Modifications for Motor Vehicles (VSB 14).

It can be downloaded here: <u>https://www.vicroads.vic.gov.au/registration/vehicle-modifications-and-defects/vehicle-modifications/vass-approval-certificate</u>

This guide will help you understand what modifications are allowed and any modification performed within the guidelines of VSB 14 does not need specific approval.

Section 12.1.3 covers Replacement or Additional fuel Tanks

Paragraph 6 notes that:

"If a replacement tank of a 125% or larger capacity than the original uses the original mountings, their strength must be checked and shown to be adequate by a VASS Signatory"

I have fitted many Long Range Tanks over the years; some like a Hilux increase the capacity from around 70Ltrs to an extended capacity of 145Ltrs. The tanks I have used over the years are made by Brown Davis (Mentioned during the talk I believe). All Long Range Tanks I have seen in the 20+ years of 4WDing have additional mounting points which significantly increase the strength of the tanks and its fitting. I have yet to see a Long Range Tank of any brand that has 125% greater capacity than the original to use only the original factory mounting points.

From all my discussions and enquiries I think it would be safe to say that in Victoria at least, no VASS certification is required for a Long Range Tank.

Trip Report 9th February 2015 Sam's trip to Aberfeldy

Hi all, just letting you all know that I'm running a trip to Walhalla/Woods Point on February 6 to Feb 8. Leaving Friday night and meeting at Moe McDonalds around 7.30pm which will be last fuel stop. I did a similar trip same time last year. Sorry for short notice but had knee surgery on 16 January and wasn't sure how I'd cope but I'm on the mend and hanging to get out. Planning to stay the night in Walhalla and do some four wheel driving the next day and head up to Woods Point and spend the night there and do some four wheel driving on last day before heading home. 
