



After lunch we headed for a look at the spill way that leads into the King River it was flowing heavily .




We then headed along upper king river rd to long spur track where we encountered a raging King river that was flowing fast and had a depth that looked like it



These are <u>Gator-Jaw</u>® synthetic shackles made by a company called BubbaRope in the US and they say that they are stronger than their steel alternatives. The biggest bonus of these units is the added safety. Imagine how much less damage these would do if they let go compared to a steel shackle.
