



We then headed to Wyperfield National Park via Beaufort, Horsham, Dimboola and stopped at Rainbow for lunch. After lunch we headed into Wyperfield National Park and camped at Wonga campground the place was huge and not a soul around we had the whole place to ourselves. We set up camp and explored the area an enjoyable evening.



After breakfast the next morning we packed up and headed up Pine Plains, then north up Gunners Track and out of Wyperfield National Park then into Sunset country.

We then stopped for lunch at Snowdrift camping site next to a big white sand dune where Tony and Sally climbed to the top, while Mick and I (the smart ones ) stayed at the bottom. you can see Tony at the top in the photo.

We stopped for a look at the Mopoke Hut. When you read the sign its a shame some

Then we drove onto Merbain west to top up our fuel then we had a look at an old Gypsum site.



We headed up Old Mail Rd to Kulnine east then onto Ned's Corner for the night. The temperature was into the high 30's, so had a swim in the Murray river to cool off. Again had the camp area all to our selves :)





This hut was built in 1962 by Alan Henschke for the purpose of having somewhere to stay after driving a mob of cattle down by horse from his property 'Yaramba', or mustering, yarding overnight to drive back home.

So as not to have to carry camping gear, mattresses blankets, camp oven, cooking utensils, tins of food were left in the hut to be used by Alan on some occasions, wet and cold nights.

Over the many years people from different parts of Australia and even overseas have stayed or just driven through, have stopped for a while and enjoyed the areas wildlife, wildflowers etc and signed Alan's visitors books. There have been two books with visitors comments previous to the ones that are left here now, but there now seems to be the odd few people coming through who don't seem to show the same appreciation of the hut and contents hence most of Alan's bedding, camp oven etc have been taken or burnt. So as not to lose the friendly appreciative comments Alan has taken home the previous books before those too are destroyed.

Next morning we continued on the Old Mail Track to the S.A. border and then headed north to the Quarantine Station where we had a look at some lovely river house boats. Even got to have a walk on one for a look.





Then had lunch and back on the road. We headed south down the Border Track to the Shearers Quarters to camp the night. Again the temperature was very hot 40+ and sat with buckets of water and towels wetting ourselves down. Once it cooled down and got dark the stars where fantastic.

The next day we headed further south on the western side of Murray Sunset National Park.

Then headed east across the park to Pink Lakes area.

Had a look around then out of the park and onto the Mallee Hwy to Pinnaroo where we decided to go into one of the Pubs and had lunch sitting at the bar.







Was great to see the local pictures on the walls and an elderly gentleman came in and sat in his normal seat at the end of the bar and got chatting.

There was a photo on the wall of four young men sitting in the same places at the bar and he was one of them - sitting in the same seat and the last one left still alive...wow.

It was also great to see that country atmos-

phere as locals came in and the young guy behind the bar already knew what their drinks were and had them ready. We had a good time chatting to the barman over lunch and our meal was HUGE. Country folk feed you well.

Feeling very full we headed south down border track to Scorpion Park and onto the start of the southern part of the track where S.A has now implemented online permits the ones that Victoria has scrapped. With no reception on our phones, we turned around and headed out of the park and into Big Desert.

We made our way across the park and into Big Billy Bore camping area. Again, had it to ourselves, and another hot night.

Just on dusk, millions of small flying bugs come through our camp and got stuck in our hair and in our drinks. They were so bad we decided not to have dinner that night. Instead we had a few wines and all had a nice cool shower and went to bed.

Morning tea was had and then we made for Pineapple Flat. Five river crossings and still not enough water to wash the dust from the tyres.


There were still a few people left camped at Pineapple Flat, but we easily found space to set up and have lunch.
