The bulk of the vehicles arrived Friday at the Tambo Crossing campground and while setting up camp, a large thunder storm rolled in. burnt to the ground.

There were no formal plans for Sunday so in the morning. Ken and Anthony needed to be back in Melbourne earlier so they split and went home via Horton's Crossing. Everyone else decided to travel back to Melbourne via Deptford.

It was quite a hot day and halfway down Nicholson track, one of the vehicles got a bit dehydrated and vomited all over the track. Shane got out to comfort the sick vehicle and decided to don his boilersuit to protect his skin from the harsh sun. It wasn't long before Shane was seen seeking shelter from the sun underneath this vehicle. After a dose of sunscreen, aloe vera and some water, the vehicle was well enough continue.
