

PRESIDENT'S REPORT



Hi all,

Welcome to the VFWDC Free Wheeling magazine.

We have a couple of annual events in July that all members should try and be a part of.

First up in July is Christmas is July. We are being hosted by St. Anne's winery again this year after great success over the last two years. The team at St. Anne's look after our members at the cellar door and put on a lunch on the Saturday. If you arrive in time you can bring your own lunch or pay for the lunch put on by the winery. The winery opens up one of their fields and allows us to camp and build a camp fire.

The Saturday arvo is spent around the fire catching up and the club committee will be putting on a BBQ dinner which is always a hit. Those who do wish to camp overnight will be treated to a breakfast put on by the committee on Sunday morning.

Please do remember to put your name down on the trip form at the next meeting so we can get an idea of numbers for catering, if you can't make the meeting to put your name down please shot an email off to the committee. A big thanks to David and Carolyn Bruinsma for putting this event together.

Also in July we have the annual snow trips. All of the members who booked in for the trip will have a great time. Unfortunately the trips this year are full but for any members who missed out there is always next year.

For those going along, please remember to come prepared, conditions can change quickly on the mountain so make sure you have all of your recovery gear, food and water for MORE than the day and warm clothes and a change for everyone who is coming along. Also, please take a few minutes to check that all of your gear is in good working order, test your winch!

Note that before attending either of these trips your club membership for 2017-18 MUST be paid up. We will be checking in the days leading up to the trips and those not paid up will be turned away. Thanks to our trip leaders this year, Sam and Bruce.

Lastly, over the last month there have been two 4wd recovery accidents around the country. One of those accidents resulted in death! Both of these accidents involved snatch recoveries. Snatch recoveries can be very dangerous so here are a couple of pointers. Take your time, there is no hurry. Before snatching you should assess the situation and decide the best methods of recovery to try.

You may be able to safely get yourself out of the situation by simply letting some more air out of your tyres and by doing some digging and if that doesn't work, let some more air out of your tyres and clear some more with the shovel, try some track building or use some traction aids, e.g. Maxtrax or TRED. Next option for me would be winch before snatch. Winching is also dangerous but winching is a slow process and doesn't involve the shock loads that snatching does. Of course if all else fails or the situation calls for it then snatching is an option.

NEVER, EVER use a towball as a recovery point! Remember to use a recovery blanket or dampener over the snatch strap, this also applies to your winch cable or rope while winching. And consider replacing your steel shackles with rope shackles, this is true for winching too. Start slowly! You do not need to be successful on the first pull, safety first. If you are unsure please talk to one of our club instructors or our experienced members.

I hope to see all our members at the next general meeting and out on the tracks.







Arrived at the Marysville Bakery to find Steve and his wife already eating breakfast. Slowly more members arrived and some waited outside at the carpark thinking we haven't arrived yet. If only they saw the cars parked around the corner...

We finally got going and convoyed up Morris Road(?) to air our tyres down and then hit the tracks. It was a cruisey scenic track with big hills to climb up and down.

For morning tea we stopped at Stockman's Reward before traversing Cornhill Track. There was three paths to take. Left was chicken track, right was a challenge but doable. Middle path was difficult. Tim had a few unsuccessful attempts until he put the rear lockers in.

While the members were scrambling up and down to assess the situation, a few things were going in my mind in no order:

- Lucky my girlfriend didn't come today. But if she did, she could have weighed down the car and wouldn't be in this situation (not true!)
- 2. Write off—I always wanted a new car
- 3. Why did I just try to adjust my seat forward when gravity is pulling it back
- 4. Do I put the transmission in park, reverse or drive?

Finally we had a solution that got me out of this mess and back down. After a few breaths, I happily took the chicken track and waited up top.

After everyone made it up, we had lunch where three motorbikers arrived through. When we left, they were spotted 200m ahead with one of them trying to push his massive bike up the hill.

We left them and continued on. We arrived at a fork where chicken track on the left and 'fun' path on the right. With my near-death fresh in my mind I chose the chicken track up!

At the Matlock Power station, we stopped for a group photo in the chilly conditions. Joe depart-

ed shortly and headed back to Melbourne.

We continued on to Spud Track where everyone got into low-first for some serious steep down hill descent. Right after the crawl was a small river crossing. Max had to wait before he tried crossing it as his brakes were smoking from the hill descent.

- Present the incoming and outgoing correspondence at the General Meeting
- Type up the minutes noting number of attendees, apologies and visitors
- Attend the committee meeting
- File correspondence in and minutes of the general meeting
- Attend to any outgoing correspondence as determined by the committee
- Ensure new member kits are up to date and available as required
- Maintain the membership list
- Manage membership cards for current year ensuring that they are signed
- Attend to annual duties, fill out the Committee Details and Membership numbers and hand to the Treasurer to return to the Association with payment

Treasurer

- The Treasurer's role is a voted Committee position and it is the Treasurer's responsibility to be fully versed with the Club Rules.
- To receive all new member application, and member renewal forms and monies and issue receipts Deposit all monies received into club bank account (from membership fees, club raffles, sales of merchandise etc.
- Keep a record of the accounts—which can be made available by request of any club member
- Prepare a monthly financial status report for the General Meetings
- Prepare the AGM report with full annual financials, which will also include president and trip coordinators reports.

Trip Coordinator

- The Trip coordinator is appointed by the committee from voted General Committee members
- Ensure attendance to each Club General Meeting fully prepared with relevant information.
- If unable to attend it is the Trip Coordinators duty to ensure another committee member has the Trip folder with the up to date information for the Club Meeting
- Ensure attendance to all Club Committee Meetings
- Be up to date with the Trip Leaders Guidelines as specified by the Adventure Activity Standards and FWDV (copies are in the front of the binder)
- Ensure all trip information is correctly recorded in the Trips binder
- Ensure the Trip Information Forms are up to date for each meeting.
- Ensure copies of other relevant forms are available if or when needed (Track survey reports, Accident Survey Form, Trip Incident form, Personal Information forms, Trip rating information)
- Ensure all TDF (Trip Data Forms) are filled in correctly and a copy is passed onto the Editor
- Liaise with the Editor and follow up any trip reports that haven't been submitted

Association Representative

- The Association Representative is appointed by the committee from voted General Committee members
- To attend all Association meetings with the President, and to report back to committee and also the General meetings with all items pertaining to the Victorian Four Wheel Drive Association.

Editor

- The Editor is appointed by the committee from voted General Committee members
- Maintain club newsletter and have it ready for publication before the general meeting each month.

General Committee

- Up to 5 General Committee positions available and are voted Committee positions.
- General Committee members may be appointed to positions as outline above.
- General Committee members not given a specific portfolio support the committee as needed.

Web Manager

- The Web Manager is a support position appointed by the committee.
- Maintain the club website, email mailboxes and mailing lists.

Merchandise Manager

- The Merchandise Manager is a support position appointed by the committee.
- Maintain club merchandise stock and replenish as necessary
- Make merchandise available to club members at meetings
