

Steve did say up-front this was going to be a challenging and technical trip - he wasn't wrong! We all met up at the base of Alcorn Track at around 10:30am on Saturday. Greetings, introductions, handshakes and such out of the way, it was time to tackle this track we'd heard so much about.

Steve headed up first in his 'Cruiser and a section and a half up the track delivered on its promise - he was stuck - massive ruts and steps to get hung up on, that were nice and slippery due to substantial recent rain in the area. Diff locks engaged, throttle applied, and a few minutes of good techniques utilised, but no good - out with the hydraulic winch.





David and myself then both had a crack in our vehicles respectively but met similar fates on the same spots as Steve - winches out on both occasions. I did however manage to do it in style, cracking a fairly big controlled wheel stand on the way up - I wasn't quietly completely crapping myself at the time at all!! (Woody, thanks for the well need spotting!)

With our rock sliders well leaned on, and 3 out of 4 vehicles winched up the first section to a relatively flat area (Ben choosing wisely to remain at the start, due to lack of sill protection), a scout of the rest of the track led to the decision to turn around - conditions too slippery to tackle safely. (Track added to the list to tackle in summer hey Steve?:)

Steve then led us off to a spot to stop and grab some well-earned lunch, before leading us on to tackle what I believed he referred to as 'the loop'. This loop, made up of Pinnacle Track & Smiths Track, provided an excellent range of tricky, technical and varied terrain which we all really enjoyed working together to get through. Steve's mates were fantastic company, spotting all who asked, talking people through tough sections, and also helping with setting up winches, track building objects for someone-who-will-remain-nameless in a silver ute who may or may not have gotten stuck going downhill.



After thoroughly enjoying working our way through the 'the loop', we headed back to camp, set up and settled in for the night. Good tunes, good company, tall stories, and a few cleansing drinks!

Sunday we awoke to snow (well I awoke to snow, everybody else was already packing up - opps). Being at only 500m this was a pleasant surprise. Packup complete Steve, David and friends said their goodbyes and headed home, while Ben, Damion and myself went on to tackle a few more tough tracks - but that's another story.
