

Its history begins with the events of 5 November 1605, when Guy Fawkes, a member of the Gunpowder Plot, was arrested while guarding explosives the plotters had placed beneath the House of Lords. Celebrating the fact that King James I had survived the attempt on his life, people lit bonfires around London; and months later, the introduction of the Observance of 5th November Act enforced an annual public day of thanksgiving for the plot's failure.

It all started on a chilly windy Saturday morning, with rain threatening and grey clouds overhead. But being the resilient bloke that I am, I encouraged my family to 'get up on time' so we could embark on the short drive through the city and out to Myrniong to St. Annes winery.

With damp roads the entire way, we arrived just before 11am and went directly inside to say hello to Shirley and Allan our hosts. Of course before we got carried away with 'setting up' we felt obliged to sample some of the fine products available at the cellar door. Previously we had limited ourselves to the ports and fortified, so this time we sampled the Whites and the Reds. My problem was, there was nothing I didn't like - so I had to be choosy with what I could select to take home.

Once our selections had been made, we placed boxes in the car and went up to the field to start our setup to 'cover' everyone in the event of rain. This proved to be a huge effort with the wind hindering us every step of the way.

Ly had arrived just after 11am and had 'light' his spit to start cooking the meat. He jumped in to help with the large marquee, and as we were doing this, Owen and Wendy arrived and also jumped In to help.

I think by about 1pm we had the marquee setup, but by 2:30 I was worried by the intensity of the wind, and also checked seabreeze web site to find out that the winds would not let up until Sunday night. So I proceeded to pull the large tarp back off because I knew I would not get any sleep worrying about



damage if the marquee took off in the wind.

A new plan had to be put into place, with a much smaller setup with a 3x3m marquee at the back of my ute with blue tarps as wind breaks was setup, with only a single 6' table to place all the food on.

A make shift setup for happy hour took place on the side of my trailer, with many people contributing with temping sugary delights.

There was a wedding taking place at the winery, so we stayed clear of the cellar door until the wedding started (at3pm) then we all invaded the cellar door and enjoyed the tastings until the wedding was over, at which point we were quick to vacate to allow the wedding guests to do the tastings.



Allan provided a 2litre flag on of port for our club to share around the camp fire and our meal. A huge thanks go to St. Annes, as the bottle only went around once and was found empty very quickly.



As the afternoon progressed everyone who had signed up for the event progressively showed up, despite the threatening weather. I believe we had 23 people all told arrive for dinner, and we enjoyed early sampling of the roast meat (all afternoon actually). And the main meal took place at 6pm as planned.

The 3 'kids' who showed up didn't want to miss out on the promised desert before disappearing off for the 'movie night', so they jumped up to help set up all the desert (fruit and custard) for everyone who still had appetite to enjoy.

Many conversations and laughter ensured around the camp fire during the evening and then the movie was over for the kids, so Ben packed up the gear which also started a small exodus of people who were not staying overnight.

Only 9 people braved the windy weather and stayed overnight, I don't think anyone stayed up very late, Carolyn and I retreated reasonably early (just after 10pm), and we hardly got any sleep due to the howling wind.





I finally woke up and crawled out of my swag at 8:30am, Owen had already started the morning fire.

I went to investigate the festival being setup around the winery, found the coffee cart already set up and returned with 2 coffees, to Carolyn's great delight. Then sent Samuel back down so he could get himself a hot chocolate.

By 9:30 we were pretty much packed up, so I walked back down to the cellar door to thank Allan and Shirley for their hospitality.

Special thanks goes out to Ly who did a wonderful job with the meat, and also to Carolyn who did all the remaining food purchases and food prep at home so there was very little to do at camp. Thanks also to Wendy who jumped up to help Carolyn get the salads ready.

A huge thanks to everyone who came along and braved the windy weather on Saturday and for those who braved the overnight winds too.

St. Annes have extended an invitation for us to come back in 'warmer' weather, which I'll elaborate on at future club meetings. We also have 2 bottles of their award winning wines to offer at our AGM raffle in August.

Immediate Past President

- The incumbent is to be a source of historical advice and information to the newly elected Executive Committee.
- The position has full voting rights similar to those of the elected Committee members.

Vice President

- The Vice Presidents role is a voted Committee position and it is the Vice Presidents responsibility to be fully versed with the Club Rules.
- To convene and run orderly meetings in accordance to the Clubs Constitution in the event of the President is absent
- To organise guest speakers for each meeting and be responsible for providing the necessary support, assistance and fellowship to ensure that their presentation is of the highest quality and they leave our meeting with a deep respect for the organisation they have just visited. Furthermore, to introduce those guest speakers to the meeting and move an effective vote of thanks for their presentation.
- Assist in all necessary aspects of administration of the Club 20 Official Newsletter of the Victorian Four Wheel Drive Club Inc

Secretary

- Collect the club mail from the club PO Box (778) at Dandenong Plaza Shopping Centre prior to the General Meeting.
- Attend the General Meeting at Dandenong Library Meeting Room ensuring that The Attendance, Apologies and Visitors books are available for members / visitors to sign in
- Take the minutes of the General Meeting
- Present the incoming and outgoing correspondence at the General Meeting
- Type up the minutes noting number of attendees, apologies and visitors
- Attend the committee meeting
- File correspondence in and minutes of the general meeting
- Attend to any outgoing correspondence as determined by the committee
- Ensure new member kits are up to date and available as required
- Maintain the membership list
- Print membership cards for current year ensuring that they are signed
- Attend to annual duties, fill out the Committee Details and Membership numbers and hand to the Treasurer to return to the Association with payment
- Ensure that you have become signatory for Club Bank Account (coordinate with Treasurer)

Treasurer

- Ensure all trip information is correctly recorded in the Trips binder
- Ensure the Trip Information Forms are up to date for each meeting.
- Ensure copies of other relevant forms are available if or when needed (Track survey reports, Accident Survey Form, Trip Incident form, Personal Information forms, Trip rating information)
- Ensure all TDF (Trip Data Forms) are filled in correctly and a copy is passed onto the Newsletter Editor
