



Would be more fun in the wet J This track is pretty kewl. Being out front, I noticed there were bunnies everywhere - 100's of them!! Dumb as a box of rocks too! They had no idea where to turn. I dunno if I made rabbit stew or not.

The end of that turns into Ryans Spur and after a few klms we stopped to look at the hut, looks like it's had some attention recently too. Nothing inside the hut but plenty of charcoal graffiti.

Then coming to the end of Ryans Spur it turns into Cornhill Track along and up to the Firetower. The track up to the tower itself was very chewed up, You could see when it had been wet sometime in the last million years and dozens of cars had taken yillions of different lines, and the ground had then dried out leaving a rough and tumble ride up. The team met up at Lilydale Maccas and at 5:30pm, our convoy of three cars departed.

We entered the infamous Toolangi State Forest via Myers Creek Road and that's when lit up the night with our spotlights and lightbars.

Stopped at Tanglefoot Picnic Area to air down and drove another 5 mins to Woodmore Track.



David headed in first and found the Navara slipping up the first muddy hill. The first sign of the 'fun' we were going to have tonight... Everyone got past that hill, and I got a bit stuck in this muddy pit with a branch/log. After a bit of reversing I climbed out unscathed.

Same couldn't be said for Jeff's BT50 who valiantly tried but eventually summoned help over the radio.





David made his way down on foot to give Jeff a hand with his brand new winch. Jeff was super excited to use his winch for the first time. He winched off a tree and got unstuck - yay! Everyone hopped back into the cars and drove up about a further 50m.

Another muddy hill and David was spinning his wheels after a few go's. He made the call to U turn out. Remember that muddy pit with the branch earlier?

My front left tyre gave it a cuddle and I heard a pshhhhhhhht. Sure enough I punctured it but couldn't see with where with all the mud.

David instructed me to drive down this crap hill on three wheels until I found a safe spot. 20m there was a flat solid landing.

From here it was a F1 pit stop mode. David and I:

- 1. got the tyre off
- 2. hi-lift jacked up
- 3. took off the spare and pumped that up (was at 5 psi!)
- 4. put the spare on and tightened it up
- 5. put the punctured on the rear wheel carrier

It felt like we completed all that in 10 mins. My first puncture while 4x4ing at my first night run and my first time at Toolangi. Great.

We got back on Sylvia Creek Road to have a quick breather and agreed let's find a camp site as this night isn't going according to plan.

At some point there was a decision made to go down this really rough track that required technical concentration otherwise there'll be panel damage.





With my left foot hard on the brake and the right foot driving through, David called on the radio to watch how he tackled this upcoming drop off.

He got through it and next was me. I did a poor attempt to follow David's line because next moment I was about leaning 30 degrees to my right.



All wheels were thankfully touching a surface but I was in the brown-stains-in-undies moment where any wrong movement in either direction could land me upside down (In my head anyway). - Attend Four Wheel Drive Victoria president meetings when required
- Oversee and assist in resolving any members disagreements
- Welcoming new members or visitors at general meetings

Immediate Past President

- This is an office bearers position and requires the incumbent to attend all General Meetings and occasional other meetings.
- The incumbent in this position, as it is not an elected position, does not hold any portfolios.
- The incumbent is to be a source of historical advice and information to the newly elected Executive Committee.
- The position has full voting rights similar to those of the elected Committee members.

Vice President

- The Vice Presidents role is a voted Committee position and it is the Vice Presidents responsibility to be fully versed with the Club Rules.
- To convene and run orderly meetings in accordance to the Clubs Constitution in the event of the President is absent
- To organise guest speakers for each meeting and be responsible for providing the necessary support, assistance and fellowship to ensure that their presentation is of the highest quality and they leave our meeting with a deep respect for the organisation they have just visited. Furthermore, to introduce those guest speakers to the meeting and move an effective vote of thanks for their presentation.
- Assist in all necessary aspects of administration of the Club 20 Official Newsletter of the Victorian Four Wheel Drive Club Inc

Secretary

- Collect the club mail from the club PO Box (778) at Dandenong Plaza Shopping Centre prior to the General Meeting.
- Attend the General Meeting at Dandenong Library Meeting Room ensuring that The Attendance, Apologies and Visitors books are available for members / visitors to sign in
- Take the minutes of the General Meeting
- Present the incoming and outgoing correspondence at the General Meeting
- Type up the minutes noting number of attendees, apologies and visitors
- Attend the committee meeting
- File correspondence in and minutes of the general meeting
- Attend to any outgoing correspondence as determined by the committee
- Ensure new member kits are up to date and available as required
- Maintain the membership list
- Print membership cards for current year ensuring that they are signed
- Attend to annual duties, fill out the Committee Details and Membership numbers and hand to the Treasurer to return to the Association with payment
- Ensure that you have become signatory for Club Bank Account (coordinate with Treasurer)

Treasurer

- The Treasurer's role is a voted Committee position and it is the Treasurer's responsibility to be fully versed with the Club Rules.
- To receive all new member application, and member renewal forms and monies and issue receipts Deposit all monies received into club bank account (from membership fees, club raffles, sales of merchandise etc.
- Keep a record of the accounts—which can be made available by request of any club member
- Prepare a monthly financial status report for the General Meetings Prepare the AGM report with full annual financials, which will also include president and trip coordinators reports.

Trip Coordinator

- The Trip coordinators role is a voted Committee position and it is the Trip Coordinators responsibility to be fully versed with the Club Rules.
- Ensure attendance to each Club General Meeting fully prepared with relevant information.
- If unable to attend it is the Trip Coordinators duty to ensure another committee member has the Trip folder with the up to date information for the Club Meeting

- Be up to date with the Trip Leaders Guidelines as specified by the Adventure Activity Standards and FWDV (copies are in the front of the binder)
- Ensure all trip information is correctly recorded in the Trips binder
- Ensure the Trip Information Forms are up to date for each meeting.
- Ensure copies of other relevant forms are available if or when needed (Track survey reports, Accident Survey Form, Trip Incident form, Personal Information forms, Trip rating information)
- Ensure all TDF (Trip Data Forms) are filled in correctly and a copy is passed onto the Newsletter Editor
