

I hope that you got to enjoy the Easter and ANZAC Day breaks. We were very lucky to have three different trips run over that period, including a couple of interstate ones.



Theory provides an overview of the tread lightly principals, vehicles dynamics and functions, tackling various terrains along with other subjects. This provides the back ground for the practical weekend.

Practical we run through individual vehicles and differences, basic recovery equipment and recap some of the theory (including home work J). We then begin the practical side running through several techniques to ensure safe vehicle recovery when in difficult situations. Once all participants are confident with these we hit the tracks to put all the theory into practice.

Sunday will be a leisurely start then we traverse a number of tracks which allow you to become familiar with your vehicles capabilities and gain further confidence. We should be finished by 2 o'clock arriving back to Melbourne around 4.

As with past participants the weekend provides confidence to safely 4WD either with the club or friends.

Starting the day off at the Gembrook bakery well worth the stop, we headed up Soldiers Road and on to Tent pole road in Gembrook. When we first put this trip together we were heading into the Bunyip state forest but the fires have closed this park so the plan B was Kirth Kiln but this was the weekend of the festival there so off to plan C.

The aim of the day was to allow people to use their equipment and work out how it all works together in a safe environment so if you get stuck you have an idea of options available. We started off by finding a tree and discussing the pros and cons of different tress and why we chose this one.

We looked at the tree trunk proctors and the position of them in relations to the vehicle. We talked about the safety aspect of a live rope and dampeners, different people showed off their choices of equipment and the discussion was



on what's the best? With the consensus being whatever works for you.

There was a good deal of banter around the different 4x4's but its all-in good fun.

The second part was adding a pully block to the winch and how this works in your favor by halving the load. To demonstrate this Stuart got out a hand winch and set it up with everyone having a go and understanding the difference of the load on the winch with a single line pull and adding the pulley block.

Moving on to tyre repairs, and discussions on what brand is best, the group all had opinions, and each has its place in different situations. I think its healthy to open this type of discussions as it increases your personal knowledge of what is out there in the retail tyre world. Stuart demonstrated how to use plugs to repair punchers and we had a variety of different kits on show. Many people used the drill to make a hole and then repair it on the demo tyre. It was noted that this was only to be used to get you to somewhere you can get a permanent repair or a new tyre.

The final thing we did was set up 3 pully blocks to allow you to pull backwards using a front winch, it's possible but complicated but as we said it allows for options if you are stuck in the bush.

We were lucky the weather was great, and everyone had a fun time and hopefully came away with a better understanding of how to use their equipment and if needed how to repair a tyre. Thanks to those who attended. We headed to the pub for lunch afterwards to continue the discussions.
