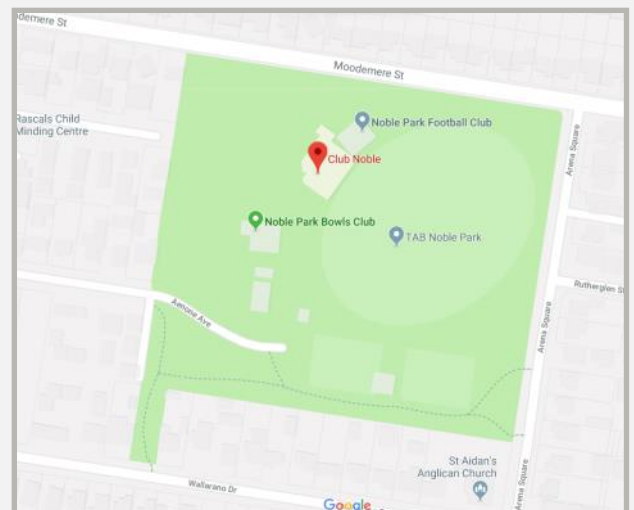
### VFWDC General Meeting Venue

I met up with Michael at our rendezvous point (the Shell servo near Donnybrook) and we were only about 10 minutes apart. A quick bite to eat and chat before we hit the road, aiming for Strathmerton by around lunchtime. We pulled into Strathmerton with the intention of spending some money while in town, only to find that the only servo around was now permanently closed and that the only general store in the main street didn't stock the type of products that Michael was after. We had a very quick look around to see what else had changed (which was not much) before making our way towards the island.

The trip in was pretty uneventful - we were soon crossing onto the island and, while I was explaining some of its history to Michael over the radio, another voice soon chirped into the conversation. It was Mark with Caroline riding shotgun and they were on the track just in front of us. Immediately behind was Tim and family so our convoy quickly went from just 2 vehicles to 4. As we made our way forward through the dust, we spread out a bit and before long, we had reached the turnoff to Long Beach on Ulupna Island. Much to my surprise, there were only a handful of others camped along the beach. The Bruinsmas had come up the night before and were already fully set up.

Wombat State Forest is a challenging environment that gives you a healthy respect for mud.

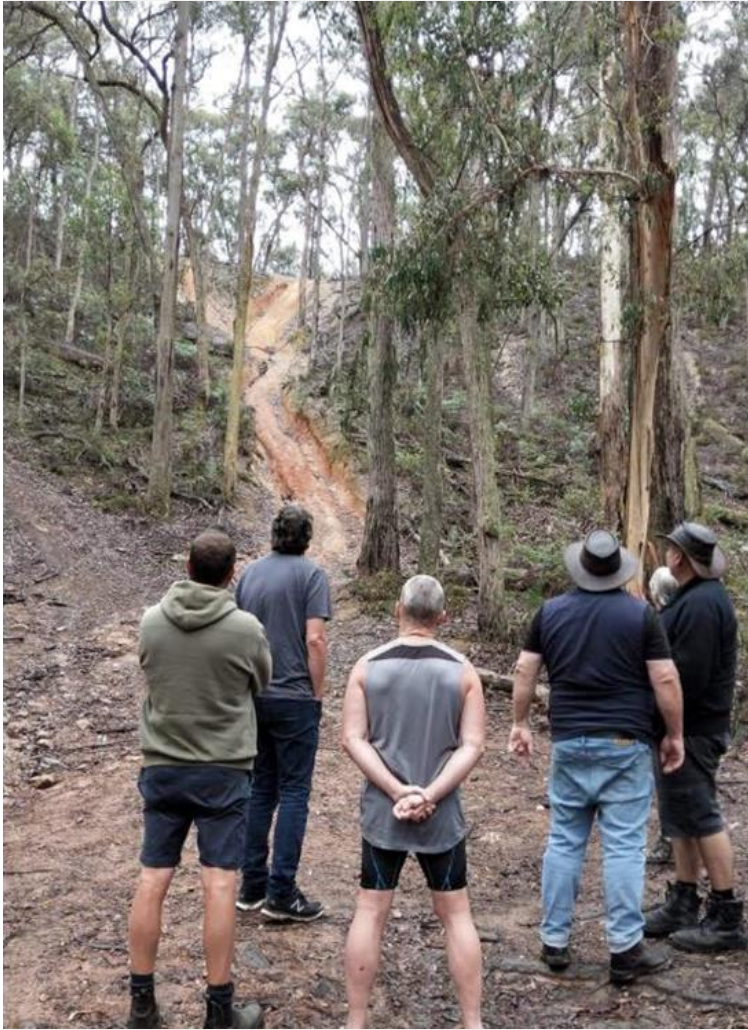
