



Easy Travel Buddy Breakfast Shakshuka AKA Tomato Eggs

Ingredients:

2 Eggs

2 Cloves of garlic chopped

1 Can diced Tomatoes

1 Onion chopped

1 Red Capsicum (Bell pepper) chop into strips

Parsley

SPICES

Paprika

Cumin

Salt & Pepper

Chilli Powder

Utensils required: Knife, Chopping board & Skillet

Method:

Chop bell peppers into fine strips, cut up onions and garlic and parsley.

Fry up onions, add bell peppers and garlic.

When cooked add can tomatoes, cumin, paprika and chilli powder to taste. Use a spoon to make two holes in the sauce for the eggs and crack your eggs.

Place in oven to cook for a few minutes.

Preheat oven to 200 degrees.

Pour 320 ml water over cous cous put lid on and leave for 5 minutes

I have the biggest sweet tooth and also love cooking on a campfire so I like to try a few different desserts when I am out in the bush as there is nothing better than finishing the day with a great meal prepared on the fire.

Brownie in an Orange.


Ingredients:

- 1 make in a cup brownie mix (will need milk to make up the mix?
- 2 Oranges
- 1 piece of Lindt dark chocolate

This is the brownie mix that I used and it was very tasty. Bought it from Woolworths.




1. Cut the top off an orange and take out the flesh of the orange leaving some juice in the bottom to get the choc/ orange flavour. I used a knife to cut round the orange between the skin and the flesh to get it out.



2. Mix up the brownie mix in a bowl adding the milk as per instructions.





3. Put the brownie mix into the orange and then push the dark chocolate Lindt square into the middle of the orange.



4. Put the top back on the orange and secure in place.



5. Wrap the orange in foil.



- 6. Place in the coals on the fire. It will take about 15 -20mins to cook depending on the heat of the coals.
- 7. Check it occasionally as it is better if slightly undercooked than over.
- 8. When ready pull off the coals and eat while everyone else looks on, jealous of your amazing dessert!.

Bananas with Marshmallow and Chocolate

Sorry no photos with this one, too easy to make and too yummy I never had a chance to take photos!

Ingredients

Banana

Marshmallows

Your favourite chocolate - I use Lindt chocolate, Toblerone, dairy milk.

- 1. Take a banana and leave the skin on. On the inside of the curve in the banana get a sharp knife and cut from the top to the bottom of the banana about 1cm from either end. Be careful not to cut the banana in half.
- 2. Cut marshmallows in half and then push them into the cut you have made in the banana, alternating with chunks of chocolate. Make sure you have marshmallows and chocolate the full length of the banana. They will stick out a little bit but that is ok.
- 3. Wrap the banana in foil so that you can easily access it when it is cooked.
- 4. Put the banana into the coals sitting on its back so that the marshmallows and chocolate in the cut are facing upwards.
- 5. Leave on the coals for 5-10mins. When cooked the banana, chocolate and marshmallow will have melted.
- 6. Take out of fire and eat while everyone else looks on, jealous of your amazing dessert.
