



It was a rich mining community so the state government at the time built a railway which opened on 3 May 1910. This operated till 1941 when it closed. Then in 1993 a band of enthusiastic volunteers raised money and formed the Walhalla Goldfields Railway Inc. and started to restore the railway the first section was opened in 1994 and it has been a labour of love since then, it goes to Thompson and back.

Lunch who can go past the café with the claim to fame "best steak sandwiches in Walhalla", seven were ordered and quickly consumed. Now for the fun off to find a track or two before dinner.

After an horrendous year being locked in and locked down it was with much anticipation, we turned our minds to taking our 'Ulti' further than the back paddock for an outdoor adventure. What would transpire however is that everything that could go wrong did indeed try to go wrong, which saw us leaving 24 hours after the agreed departure time.

In the preceding weeks we were travelling along Eastlink when a pebble flicked up and left its calling card on the windscreen - too big to ignore and smack bang in the middle of the driver's line of vision. We ended up on a site very near the road and just down from the 'bog-a-trons' - they were at least not the 'Sheepyard Flat' variety where the contents come out to greet you!! We did overlook the river, if you had your glasses on!! Being the long weekend there were 3 or 4 cars in the campsite. On the Monday when folk were beginning to leave, we took a stroll around to see where we might actually like to camp for the following 4 nights. We bumped into a young girl who told us of a beautiful spot up around the corner - a quiet, secluded, solitary camp near a babbling brook. After a super quick pack up we were established in our new home in under 30 mins with the chairs out and a drink in our hands.









The four days passed far too quickly - but we enjoyed reading, sleeping, playing countless games of Uno, enjoying the time to create delicious dinners, happy hour that extended into a number of hours. Water was on hand for bathing - however being very secluded - we did away with the idea of a shower tent and just to get that 'Norsca' feeling we just used water straight out of the river - they were bracing showers but invigorating!! Brett decided to take a 'dip' in the river - I did mention secluded didn't I, so he went in the raw - being a river there is a rocky, pebbly foundation - walking very gingerly he fumbled his way into the river. However, upon meeting uneven ground in a few places he kept bending over to place his hands in the water to balance himself. Sitting downstream and him facing upstream - there was no alternative - my eyes can never unsee what they saw - they remain blemished and scarred and in very poor visual health.

As we packed up after our very relaxing and restoring break, we will return to Pinch River a beautiful, quiet and well positioned camp to further explore NSW. We made our way up the Barry Highway a very well-maintained route with breathtaking views down the valleys of the Snowy River. Snaking our way to Jindabyne it never fails to amaze me the conditions the early pioneers endured, their foresight and tenacity to open up the country for the colonisation of Australia.

We made our way into the ACT to catch up with family and then down through Braidwood to the coast. This area was one of the hardest hit with the fires - nature is awe inspiring, to see the regeneration and hope showing in the fresh green shoots, leaves and branches and the miles of miles of burnt land screaming out - we are still alive! Patches of forest were so badly burnt in some areas life is still to return, but in the main - the roads and infrastructure have been repaired. Life in the small towns has resumed and the resilience of local people with their new homes, some still under construction - making it a privilege to be able to invest into their communities. I wrote this prior to devastation of the floods, many of the areas we drove through are now underwater - we only imagine what these poor people are going through.

We enjoyed the 25th Anniversary Muster with the Ultimate community with over 330 people attending - whilst it had not been announced that weekend, we came home to learn that Ultimate had won the title of Camper Trailer of the Year - 2021.

It was a wonderful trip - we did not air down (nor up n) once, we did not engage low range once - we did however appreciate the fact we have the freedom, capabilities, opportunities and desire to enjoy and explore the great outdoors with our vehicles.



Campfire Chicken Nachos

Get your campfire ready!
You will need hot coals for this one.

SERVES 6

INGREDIENTS

3 ½ Cups Chicken Pieces and fry (Or buy a cooked chicken)

1 x Cup Enchilada Sauce

½ Onion (chopped finely)

1 x Can tin corn kernals

1 x Can black beans (rinsed)

3 x Cups Mozzarella Cheese

Salt

Tortilla chips

Coriander

1 x Lime - cut in to wedges for serving

1 x disposable aluminium tray (You don't want to clean it—I'm telling ya—It's a shocker!)



- Cut up and fry up chicken pieces
 (or buy a cooked chicken and break up into small pieces)
- Add enchilada sauce, onion, corn, black beans, salt and paper and 2 cups of cheese in a bowl and mix.
- Get your aluminium tray ready, place tortillia chips in and spread chicken mixture over tortillas, and remaining cheese on top. Cover with aluminium foil (make sure you seal it).
- Place over the campfire. (Not directly on hot coals but above them)
- When cheese is melted and chicken is warmed through, (Approx. 15 minutes)
- Top with coriander and serve with lime wedges.
 Also if you want optional extras— Mash Advacado & Jelapenos for the finishing touch.

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
