

Tasty Treats

This month we have another veggie meal for all you meat eating maniacs out there. Remember we need to start eating more veggies for our health and also to save the planet. And it keeps you regular too!!

Turkish One-Pan Eggs & Peppers

Brilliant quick dish for that late brunch, easy and one pan only.

Ingredients:

Olive oil & caster sugar 2 onions, sliced 1 red pepper & 2 chilis 1 tin of chopped tomatoes 4 eggs Parsley, garlic Creamy Yoghurt



Method

Heat the oil in a heavy-based frying pan. Stir in the onions, pepper and chillies. Cook until they begin to soften. Add the tomatoes and sugar, mixing well. Cook until the liquid has reduced, season.

Using a wooden spoon, create 4 pockets in the tomato mixture and crack the eggs into them. Cover the pan and cook the eggs over a low heat until just set.

Beat the yogurt with the garlic and season. Sprinkle with parsley and serve from the frying pan with a dollop of the garlic-flavoured yogurt.

New members day trip to Bunyip (Sat 26th Feb)

With quite a number of new members joining the club during Covid, but never actually getting a chance to go out on a trip, there was quite a good sign up for this trip. Andre kindly volunteered to lead the trip and conducted a detailed recce to find suitable tracks (and less suitable ones too!).

The crew met in Gembrook market car park early on the Saturday morning, with many driving up wondering if the various ute and 4x4 trucks they saw along the way were part of the team (or was that just me?). There were the usual introductions as names were mentioned and went in one ear and straight out the other, followed by a quick round the houses chat about our experience to date. It appeared most of us had some experience and Andre seemed pleased we weren't all completely fresh. There was a little allocating of positions within the convoy, with Nev being deemed the most competent and experienced to bring up the rear. And then we were off, although almost immediately it got a bit confusing as 2 other trucks slipped into our convoy. With the dust and general lack of experience from us all, we nearly followed the wrong cars the wrong way but between us we managed to get back on track and ended up at Dyers Picnic Ground to deflate tyres and get the obligatory team photo.



Once the messing about with the tyre deflators had finished, we saddled up and soon turned off the main track to start heading up Anderson's Track. It was a very dry day so it was dusty and generally pretty easy going on the tracks. The major ascent we lined up and went up one by one with supervision with Andre to make sure we were not doing anything silly. There was of course plenty of photo taking by the passengers and family members as we accelerated steadily up the steep incline.

At the top we stopped, with grins on our faces, and congratulated each other (and ourselves) on achievement of reaching the summit without making a dummy out of ourself. Andre seemed happy with our progress and we jumped back on board, all feeling a little more relaxed for whatever was to come.



We continued along Anderson's Track and onto Blue Range Road before entering Bunyip Ridge Track. Here there were a few more steeper sections and Andre again dismounted and displayed his physical prowess by running back up to guide us down.



After this we wound our way to the start of the infamous Gentle Annie Track. Not sure why its named this but there wasn't anyone called Annie around and it definitely wasn't gentle in sections. In fact it had an ominous wrecked and crushed car marking the start of it.



At the now famous rock step section there was much discussion of the best route to take, who had what clearance and who was foolish enough to give it a go. Andre, being the inspirational leader he is, showed us all how to do it and led by example, being the first to go down. He made it look simple (with some excellent guiding on the radio) and we were filled with confidence that we could also do it. A few graunches and jolts later, and we had navigated our way down and all had an increased sense of what our vehicles were capable of.



Lunch was taken a bit further along whilst dodging some feral looking hoons in their crazy trucks tearing up the track. There were some tasty snacks on offer with Instant Noodles and very comfy looking seats from Luke and Kelsey probably winning the day. The afternoon saw us heading down off Gentle Annie, and further along taking the Quartz track which had some good views along the ridge lines. Of course we waited until all the views had disappeared before deciding it was time for a team photo. We decided to block a track (right on a corner - whose idea was that??!) and line ourselves up for the team photo.



Big shout out to Andre for a great day out. It was run in a very relaxed atmosphere which gave us all the chance to explore our vehicles capabilities without feeling any pressure, fully supported by the rest of the team. It also gave us a chance to meet new people and share our experience. Thanks to everyone who came along and again thanks Andre.

Rig Rundown

This month James has stuck his hand up (yes he actually volunteered) to talk us through his set up. James is probably one of our youngest members and is obviously very proud of his truck. And he came up with a much better name for the section - Rig Rundown. Thanks James!!

Gday, my name is James and this is my 2016 Holden Colorado 7 Trailblazer. This is my first car which i got in April 2021 just before my 17th Birthday. I purchased it off my dad who upgraded to the new Hilux that won't even touch dirt.


I got the car fairly stock as my dad did occasional 4wding but mainly used it for touring. He had an Ironman Bullbar with some Ironman spotlights, Yokohama All Terrains and just a 2" Lift Kit all round.



First thing i did was remove the third row seats to put a draw system. I found a guy from Perth WA who made a custom steel frame that bolted into the existing holes. I have a basic 12V system with a 45L Fridge. In the drawers i just carry around recovery gear in one and camping utensils and food in the other.



Second thing i did was put a Rola Titan alloy roof rack on which i managed to fit myself with a little help from my dad. Then i put on a 42" Kings Slim Light Bar, and two 4" Spot Lights on the back which are wired up for when i put it into reverse, they turn on. I have also just got a Kings Awning and Maxtrax Holders.





I then decided to put on a Dominator Xtreme Winch, Ironman scrub bars and steps and new heavy duty ironman front springs to help with the weight.





Since adding on all these accessories, i've taken my car on a couple trips and haven't had a single problem. I haven't had to use the winch at all yet, as i am a good driver, and it's just a really reliable car. Can't wait to be able to explore more of Australia once i get my licence.

- •Stainless steel snorkel
- •Clear View Next Gen Mirrors
- •Kaymar Rear Bar
- •New tyres and rims
- •Upgrade to a new 80 Chanel UHF
