



Track Classifications

<u>Four Wheel Drive Victoria</u> have a track grading classification scale which has been developed to assist in advising Trip Leaders and participants on 4WD trips of the type of tracks that they can expect to encounter. On most trips participants can expect that a variety of tracks will be traversed each with an appropriate rating. Trip Leaders should advise participants of the range of track ratings expected to be encountered on the planned route. The following classifications will assist in determining an overall Trip Rating:

Details


A final fuel stop and quick lunch break later, we hit the dirt and drove Tamboritha Road towards Arbuckle Junction. From there, we turned off onto Moroka Road until we found Mount Wellington Track. We spotted a decent sized tree that had fallen nearby so out with the chainsaw for some firewood.

Once loaded with wood, we progressed towards the top of Mount Wellington where everyone shifted into low range. Unfortunately, by the time we made the ascent the lovely clear skies that we experienced in the morning had changed to low lying clouds which impeded our visibility. We stopped briefly at the peak to take in the limited views before descending the other side of the mountain.





When we arrived at camp (Miller's Hut), it was around 4pm. There was another group already set up so we went about setting up wherever else people thought was best. Some wood splitting later and we had a nice fire going to keep us warm.



It didn't take long before darkness descended upon us and, after the effects of a full day's drive, the last of us retired at about 9:30 pm.

Next morning, we made our way along the final stretch of Miller's track which would take us to a plateau with views out to the Gables and Lake Tali Karng. The remaining section of track to reach that plateau was only about 4-5 km long but it was extremely overgrown and fallen trees abounded every couple of hundred metres or so. The terrain was very challenging, requiring some careful maneuvering and a few reversals to pick the right lines.





Our chainsaws also got a good workout and I would say we cleared at least a dozen or so fallen trees and snapped branches along the way. Progress was very slow and we even had to do a bit of spotting which, thankfully, Sally and Tristin volunteered to do (thanks guys!) as we inched our way forward.



Of the 6 vehicles in convoy, the first 3 made it to the plateau. Given the difficulty of the last 500m or so of track (which included straddling a long erosion gully), the rest of the group decided to walk up. With the exception of Michael who was the only one to drive the entire length of the track, we made our way to the Sentinels on foot. From there we began the walking trail that takes you to a lookout affording views of Lake Tali Karng. Unfortunately, the trail was not well defined and most

of us ended up at a different lookout point to that which we intended. Tristin and Michael did a bit of exploring and made it to the correct lookout. However, it was a good half km away and would have probably taken the group an extra 45 mins or so to get there, plus the same back. So we decided to make our way back towards the vehicles and call it day.

The descent from the plateau was much quicker than the drive up but it still took the best part of an hour to cover all 4-5 km or so back. Once back at camp, we were quick to get a fire going again while we sat around enjoying happy hour. The Subaru club made an appearance but, after evaluating the now rather full campground, decided to press on to another spot for the evening.



On Sunday, we broke camp at around 9:30 am and retraced our tracks back towards Mount Wellington. This time, nature was kind to us and we were able to take in some breathtaking views.



We took a number of photos from the top at the survey marker then made our way along Maroka Range Track towards Maroka Hut. It was here that we spotted the Subaru club again as we completed the short walk towards the hut.





From there we drove out to Horseyard Flat to inspect Horseyard Hut and surrounds.



We stopped for a short lunch break before taking Marathon Road back towards civilisation. We pulled up at Briagolong township about an hour or so later, hoping to grab a cup of coffee. Unfortunately, the coffee shop was closed so we all went our separate ways back towards home.

It was a great extended weekend away in the presence of great company with some challenges along the way.


